Strong Learner Project

On Tuesday, a group of children from KS2 were visiting lessons and observing their peers as part of our ROBUS Research Review project identifying strong learning. The children were accompanied by visiting children from Kingston Primary School and were looking for examples in class of children being strong learners. They of course found many examples and were very eloquent when describing what they saw. The children from Kingston were wowed by what they saw! We are very proud of all the children who took part. Patrick Ridgwell (Ants) tells of his experience below:-

"We were taken out of class and we went down to the hall after we got the twelve children we needed. Then we met the children from Kingston. We got sorted into our groups and then went to different classes. We had to write down how many people were really strong learners, strong learners and those coming up to being strong learners. For a strong learner we had to look to see if they were concentrating, not talking whilst the teacher was talking and being resilient when the work got hard. We could do a tally chart and then ask the name of the child who we thought was a really strong learner. We visited three classes in total. During the visit we had a break and had biscuits and a choice of either orange juice, blackcurrant juice or water. At the end we compared our information. It was really fun that we got to see what the other classes were doing and who was a really strong learner. I'm

looking forward to going to Kingston as I'm looking forward to seeing what their school is like and what they do in class."

Youth Sports Board Meeting

On Thursday, a contingent of four children from Thundersley, Ayah Pounds (Otters), Rosie-Belle Horsman (Badgers), Edward Potts (Otters) and Lewis Grigson (Badgers) visited the Deanes School as part of the Youth Sports Board for their first meeting. Ayah gives her account of the meeting below:-

"First of all we went into a dance studio and we waited for all the schools to arrive. Then we got our t-shirts and we got separated into groups and we did different activities such as tennis, dodgeball and ideas for different activities and meetings. 

KS1 Music Festival

On Wednesday, the children from Robins' Class were involved in the KS1 Music Festival together with other local schools. The children enjoyed singing songs about the weather they had been learning and some had the task of playing instruments to accompany the singing. It was a lovely morning and Ava Rothon gives her account of the event below:-

Essex Sportshall Athletics County Finals at Garons

After winning the District competition back in February, T.P.S. Grey Team competed in the County Sportshall Athletics Finals on Wednesday, at Garons Park in Southend. 14 winning schools from all over the county were ready to play their part in the competition which meant that the standard was going to be incredibly high. However, every one of our 24 Year 6 children that competed rose to the challenge and took their performances to the next level. So many amazing personal bests were recorded in the field



from triple jump to javelin, and on the track the children ran with such determination and desire, bouncing off the reverse boards and racing right to the line every time. When the results were in, the final countdown was an absolute nail-biter! One by one the positions were awarded and celebrated - until eventually it was announced that Thundersley had come second! Mr Jetten, Mr Yorston and Mr Wilson were absolutely gobsmacked and the children were understandably so proud of their performance. What an achievement, and many thanks go to the parents for their support, for helping with transport on the day and bringing children in to school early for training sessions! What a team effort and roll on the athletics season! Macey Robinson (Otters) and Bobby Foster-Pasterfield (Badgers) give their respective accounts of the event below:-

"I did the obstacle relay and it was really fun and everyone tried their best however, it was really competitive. Everyone did really well and everyone was cheering and very supportive. There were hurdles, speed bounce and high stepper. I liked doing the high stepper because I had to think really hard to make sure I didn't miss one. I also did the speed bounce separately which was really fun. I had 20 seconds to do as many as I could and I got 55! I did a 4 x 1 race. That was sprinting off the reverse board at either end. That was tricky going off the reverse board but it was still fun. Then I did the vertical jump. At first I had to put my arms up so they could measure my height and then I jumped and I got 33cm. It was quite tricky because I had to do a special technique and I had to jump up really high. Overall it was very competitive and very supportive. People were cheering everyone on from the sides, even if they weren't in our team. I did the athletics last year but didn't go to the County Finals. I really enjoy athletics and I will miss it as I am leaving this year but I hope to do it at King John. No-one expected that we would come in the top three but in the end we came second. Everyone was really excited and started screaming. I felt really good coming back to school wearing my silver

medal as I've never been in the County Finals before." (Macey Robinson)

"It was very nerve wracking watching everyone run past. After a few races my race was called up and I did the 2×2 relay. It was very difficult because there were so many talented students there from other schools but I did manage to win my race. I felt very happy that I managed to achieve something like that as I've never got into an athletics competition before let alone win! I also did vertical jump which I think I got one of the highest scores out of everyone who went. I think I got 39cm and 41cm. I preferred the relay race as there was a lot more encouragement from the side so it gave me more motivation to do well. The whole event was very exciting as it was at such a high level and I was very proud of the whole team as we did end up coming second overall because of all our efforts to win. I really enjoyed it because I've not taken part in an indoor athletics competition before and it was special as I have done two close together. I was very proud of myself to be able to win the medal and my mum was very excited about it because she said in the morning that she thought that I was going to do really well and get into the top 5!



Let Girls Play

On Friday, it was the turn of the children in Years 1, 2 and 3 to participate in the 'Let Girls Play' programme with Miss Turner-Powell. The girls had a wonderful time learning football skills and Amelia Buckingham (Rabbits) tells of her exciting session below:-
