### Quad Kids Athletics Competition

School finished as double winners in the district Quad Kids Athletics competition. Quad Kids is designed to develop all-round athletics skills as each competitor is scored in 4 disciplines: a jump, throw, sprint and long distance run. 4 boys and girls from Year 4 and Year 6 had been selected after trials in PE lessons and then undertook extra training at school. The great effort clearly paid off as the children did themselves and the school proud and Mr Wilson and Mr Yorston were delighted with the extraordinary effort that they put in on the day to beat personal bests and raise their performances for the team. Well done to all involved. Bobby Foster-Pasterfield (Badgers) and Lola Duffield (Sparrows) give their respective accounts of the competition below:-

"When we arrived at Deanes, we went straight into the competition and the Year 6s started with the long jump. They ordered it in schools and each child would jump, go back to the line of their school, until every child had jumped three times. My best jump was 1.82mtrs. The next event Year 6 did was the 600m middle. distance run which I found the hardest because I had to pace myself so that I didn't run out of breath but still had to be fast enough to get a good time. I came 1st and I was really happy with myself as it was a personal best. We had lunch next and then the Year 6s did throwing and I didn't beat my personal best but I did get a good score. The final event we did was the sprinting. I came 2<sup>nd</sup> in that. At the end we all waited for the results and it was announced that the Year 4 team came 1st as well as the Year 6 team. We were all really happy but we tried not to show it as we didn't want to upset the other schools. We went up to the desk and collected our gold medals and I was chosen to collect the trophy as well. After the announcements we took a school photo to show how well we had done. The whole competition was really fun as it was chilled out and it wasn't like the indoor athletics where there were ten schools. My favourite event was probably the long distance running because I never really did it, I always did sprinting so it was

quite nice to have the opportunity to compete in the long distance. When I go to my Secondary School, which is King John, I hope that I will do as well in the competitions there as I have done at this school." (Bobby)

"At first we arrived and we had a snack and lots of water so we didn't get dehydrated. Then we headed over to the first event for Year 4 which was the long distance. I had to run 400m and it was very fun and it was all about the timing not what I got placed as. Then we had to go to the long jump which was our second event and all the other schools were sitting there waiting. It was very fun. It was one of my favourite events and it was not about how high you jumped but the distance of it. I jumped 1.81m first, my second one was 1.96m and my third one was 1.97m. Then we headed over to the shade by the tree to have a little chat and tell each other how much we enjoyed it. We also had our lunch and a drink and we drank a lot of water. After that we headed over to our third event which was the short distance. We had to run 200m and I came third overall in my group. Last but not least, we did the relay which I came third in but it was all about having fun and it wasn't about who won and who lost. At the end, we were waiting and sitting with our whole school to hear the results of who had won and who had lost. Then we found out that Year 4 had won 1st place. Everyone was cheering and as the schools were leaving they were saying well done and we were saying it back. I felt very happy for myself that we had accomplished it and I had got a gold medal. I enjoyed the whole thing and I would love to carry on doing athletics and more sports events." (Lola)

# Sports Day



On Thursday it was time for our annual Sports Day. As always, the children were very excited and we kicked off with the EYFS/KS1

children who came out full of energy and



enthusiasm. They rotated through all sorts of activities showing off many different skills and a great deal of teamwork and resilience. The morning session finished with some team relays with the children running confidently and very speedily. Next was the turn of the KS2 children who competed fantastically and there were smiling faces all round as they rotated through their carousel of events. The water station proved to be a big hit in the heat and it was hard to tell who was wetter, the children or the staff! This also finished with the team relays and there were some truly incredible running performances with a back drop of cheering adults. The day finished with the house point results - Blue Dolphins being the winners! Lincoln Bellinger (Squirrels) and Eli Waiwaiku (Dragonflies) tell of their respective Sports Day experiences below:-

"Our first activity was a cricket activity where we had bowl the ball onto the stump. If we hit it, it was worth one point and if we missed we had to pick the ball up and go to the back of the line. We then had a break. After that we went onto a sprinting activity where we had to race against 3 others from different house groups. I won one and came second in the other. Then it was throwing a howler. Every cone was spaced at 5m, 10m etc. and we had to throw it to see how far we got. I threw it either 15m or 20m - it looked guite a long way. The next activity was running to a bucket with water in and collecting water in a cup and then running back to another bucket and pouring it in. The children with the most water in their bucket at the end won. Miss Dawson and Miss Budden were trying to make us spill the water and cool us off by squirting water at us. It was quite nice as it cooled us down. The next activity was lacrosse where we had to get the ball into the goal using a lacrosse stick. I managed to score 5. Then we had another break. Then we had a netball activity where we had to shoot. I managed to get 3 in. Then we had an egg and spoon race. We had a squidgy foam egg on a spoon and had to weave in and out of some poles. If we dropped it we had to stand still and put it back on the spoon which slowed us down. Our final activity was an

obstacle course. I liked doing the sprinting activity the best because I just love sprinting. At the end, the House Team results were given and Blue Dolphins won. As House Captain I picked up the trophy. This is my last Sports Day at Thundersley and it will be one I remember!" (Lincoln)

"For Sports Day I did a football thing and I did a cup race and I did an egg race. I did a jumping thing and had to jump over yellow bars. I did a ball race and I had to balance it on something and I had to go under the parachute. Someone in Chipmunks passed me the baton and I had to run to the next person and I had to give them the baton. I liked the football one the best. I thought it was good. I watched my brother do his when I was 4 as I couldn't do it as I wasn't at school." (Eli)
