Polite Reminder

<u>Earrings</u>

The rule for PE lessons is that jewellery, including earrings and retainers, must be removed due to injury risks for the wearer and others. Taping earrings is not recommended as it does not provide sufficient safety and can be ineffective. If a child cannot remove an earring, they may be excluded from the practical aspect of the lesson. Parents are responsible for removing earrings on PE days, and for newly pierced ears, there is often a sixweek period during which earrings cannot be removed, leading to potential exclusion from practical PE activities.

Early Birds Breakfast Club & Treetops After School Club




We offer a Breakfast Club (7.45am to the start of school) and an After School Club called Treetops (3.15pm to
