On Thursday last week, Thundersley girls had their second league game of the season against Winter

Gardens. We didn't get off to the greatest of starts, conceding a goal within the first 2 minutes, but the girls rallied well and from that point on defended resolutely with some tremendous saves from our fantastic Goal Keeper. With moments left in the game, having trailed 1-0 from the start, the girls finally made the break through and with 20 seconds to go, Isabella Legg stormed through on goal and fired a shot into the bottom corner of the net. A really wonderful display of courage and resilience which paid off with Thundersley taking a hard earned point from the game. Once again proving they are the best they can be. Issabella Reeves (Ants) gives details of the match below:-

"We drew 1-1. We walked over to the field and we waited for Winter Gardens to come and did some practicing. Then we did two people dribbling the ball to the





goal whilst three people tried to stop them. I was off until the last five minutes of the first half and when I went on, I was in midfield. In the first half Winter Gardens scored one goal. Fifteen to twenty minutes into the second half, we had lots and lots of corners as when the corners were taken a member of the other team would kick it off. We also had lots of throw ins which me and Jessica (in Year 6) took. Then in the last few seconds of the second half, Isabella Legg scored a goal which made it a draw. If I had the chance to play another game I definitely would and even if we lost, I would still enjoy it."

#### Cross Country Competition



On Wednesday, a team of 48 runners from Thundersley made their way to Garons for the local Cross Country competition. There were around 25 schools in attendance with over 1,000 children participating. The event is broken into age races with boys and girls in Years 3 to 6 competing in teams. The Year 3 girls led off in the first race full of nerves and excitement. They were roared on by the cheers of the crowd and ran tremendously in their first ever competitive race. They were then followed by the Year 3 boys and the Year 4 teams all of whom ran with great courage and resilience. The Years 5s and 6s were next and everywhere we looked there were yellow shirts out at the front of their races. There were many individual medals throughout the afternoon and then all the schools gathered to hear how the teams were placed. Amazingly, Thundersley Year 3 girls placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and Year 3 boys managed to secure 1<sup>st</sup> place and a trophy. The children were of course delighted. The Year 4 results were read out next with the Year 4 boys placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall and the girls winning their race and taking home a second trophy for the school. Year 5 results were next and Year 5 girls had battled themselves to win their trophy







amazing individual performances, the Year 5 boys and Year 6 teams were not quite able to secure a trophy of their own. This was a truly remarkable team performance and all 48 children in attendance showed stamina, fortitude and desire. We now have a large number of children who will be representing Thundersley at the County Finals, which is very exciting news. This was another example of the children being the best they children can be. Alfie Hulton (Squirrels) and Ellen Weeden (Owls) give details of their experiences below:-

"When I was chosen it was after assembly and they read out all the names. I felt excited and nervous. We did training on the Friday and Monday before. On Wednesday, we were called to the hall and we had to bring a towel in case it rained, shorts, warm clothing, a coat, lunch and a water bottle. Then they called the Year 6s to go onto the minibus. We had fun on the minibus and it was a nice journey. When we got there, we parked a little way away and then walked. We had to carry the gazebo and mat. When we got there, it was a massive field and we were on the far side near the football pitch with a temporary fence around. We were then shown around the track. The Year 3 girls ran first after we had set up the gazebo and all the other schools arrived. The second race was the Year 3 boys and Chase Goodwin came 3<sup>rd</sup> and got a medal. Louie Tucker came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Year 4 boys. When it was my turn to race, I did a warm up with Leo, Connor, Noah, Joseph and Lenny and right before the race started, we took our jumpers off and got into our shorts. We all got ready to race with our Thundersley yellow tops showing. As soon as the race started, we had to follow a person in green to show us where to race. We did a small lap first and then we did a larger lap across the entire filed and at the end of the race, there was a zone where you had to walk through and get a number. I came 65<sup>th</sup> out of 174. I thought it was nerve wracking but fun. At the end there was a massive ceremony where trophies were given to the winners and Thundersley ended up winning three! We



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then got back on the minibus and came back to school." (Alfie Hulton)

"I walked with my partner to the coach and we played I Spy. When we got there, we had a little bit of our lunch and then we went to line up for our race. I felt excited. When we started the race, I was going to come into 2<sup>nd</sup> place but slowed down a bit and came in 5<sup>th</sup> place. After it finished, we had the rest of our lunch and then we ran around to try and warm up. Then we went back on the coach once all the races were finished. I enjoyed it because it was fun and enjoyable as I like going on coaches and I like running." (Ellen Weeden)
