On Thursday, we had our annual Finals Day event which was for KS2 children. The event consists of sprint heats and finals and then an open long distance race for each year group. The sun came out for the event and the children were excited to get started. The Year 3 children set the tone with some speedy sprinting and this continued throughout all of the heats. After the heats came the sprint finals and my goodness what a set of races we had! The races were met with cheers from all the children and adults in KS2 and there were some incredibly close finishes. As always there was tremendous sporting attitude from all runners congratulating each other regardless of where they finished. Following the sprints came the open long distance event and it was

As always, the children towards the back of the races received the loudest cheers of the day as their friends and classmates could see the amazing effort they were putting in. This was a really fun morning and it was delightful to see so many children running with courage and determination. Another example of the children being 'the best they can be'. Archie Alsop (Kestrels) gives his account of the event below:-

"In PE lessons we did sprint races to qualify for the Finals Day and I came 3rd. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> for these. Then a couple of weeks later we found out who was in Finals Day and I was in Finals Day and I was really excited and I felt like a big weight had been lifted off my shoulders as I normally qualify so that was one bit out of the way and now I could win some medals. On the day, I felt really nervous. We sat down and watched the first couple of races and then they called Year 5s. That's when I felt really nervous but also quite calm. We were at the running track and then the whistle went and I just sprinted as fast as I could and I felt like I was floating. At the finish line I came 2<sup>nd</sup> and I was super happy with myself. Then I was congratulating my friends and my friend and I said we couldn't believe we had done it. Then I had the sprinting final and that was really nerve wracking. The whistle went off and I did what I did in the first race. At the finish line I came 3<sup>rd</sup> and finally got some silverware. It is the first medal I have got for sprinting in Finals Day and I felt over the moon and extremely happy. My legs weren't aching and then I went onto the 600m which was really painful. There were about 25-30 kids and the top few didn't change. I enjoyed the race and when I came over the finish line for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time I looked down and had two bronze medals. Even though it was competitive everyone congratulated everyone else on where they came and it was a very nice atmosphere after the race even though we were out of breath, we could feel the happiness."

On Friday, the Year 4 children showcased their recent work on the Romans in an assembly to their parents/carers. Evie Barber (Sparrows) and Cooper Kenrick (Bears) describe the assembly below:-

"The assembly was about the Romans and what they used to do like build straight roads. They also made mosaics. We had Roman Gods and Goddesses and there was a Queen called Boudicca and she didn't want the Romans taking over. I made a mosaic out of tiny squares of different coloured paper. The Mosaics got to wear coloured clothes. We also did some songs. My favourite song was Boudicca. A few people played instruments. I played a little shaker. We did actions for some of the songs.
