A super start to the term, with children ready to learn, working hard and determined to succeed. More than ever, the children's

well-being is key to their success, so our focus on Personal, Social & Health Education continues, as well as a commitment to having children be active for an hour each day through clubs, active breaks, PE lessons and daily active sessions in class. If you feel your child needs support socially or emotionally please let us know.

Although, our rich, exciting curriculum continues, we have four main aims for children's learning this term:-

Improved oracy - we know that children who are exposed to and can use a wide vocabulary in their speech read and write better.

Improved reading - we know that this is the key to all learning and that to improve, the children need to read lots of high quality texts at home and at school.

Improved automaticity in number - we know that children need to be able to quickly recall their number bonds and times tables without using objects or their fingers to work them out.

Improved problem solving in maths children need to be able to understand what needs to be calculated before they can attempt to solve a problem, which involves comprehension.

We really need your help in this! Every child should be reading at least 5 times per week, practising their Lucky Listeners homework daily and practising their number facts whether number bonds or times tables.

This is quite a commitment, I know, but if every child has the support at home to do this, they will end this year far from having lost learning, but having made significant progress. Please help your child not only to make up on lost learning, but to fly! In KS2 particularly, those children who can answer a multiplication question and the related division questions in the wink of an eye have a huge advantage compared to those who can't. By the end of Year 4 children should know all their times tables to 12 X 12 automatically. Every child, except possibly those with particular needs in maths, is capable of learning number facts - it just takes practise. Thank you for your support in this


