Dear Parent/Carer,

I am continually reminded of the resilience of our children – they have coped amazingly with all that has been thrown at them this year!

Thanks to your hard work at home and all the opportunities for language enrichment in school, reading across the school has held strong, despite the pandemic. This is quite a feat! We now need to turn our focus (as well as keeping reading!) to number bonds and multiplication facts. We need to make it our mission as a community.

10 =	1+9	2+8	3+7	4+6

In EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2, the main aim is to develop children's knowledge of counting, numbers and number bonds

so that by the end of Year 2, they can rapidly answer questions within 20 without having to work them out - they just know that 5 and 6 makes 11, that 7 and 8 makes 15. If they can do this - any numbers higher than that can then be figured out with ease. In Year 2, they also start to learn multiplication tables. In Years 2, 3 and 4 they work their way through the tables and by the end of Year 4, children are expected to recall rapidly answers to multiplication and division facts to 12X12. In June, children in Years 4 and 5 will be taking part in a version of the Government's Multiplication Check Test. where they are given 25 quick fire multiplication questions to answer with 6 seconds for each question. I know that children in both year groups are absolutely working their socks off to achieve this - please give them mas much help at home as you can. Parents will receive the results of the check once completed.


