Kestrels visit to The Deanes

As with the two other Year 6 classes recently, Kestrels had an exciting visit to The Deanes last Friday to spend the afternoon in their new Science block. The children enjoyed making burglar alarms and conducting experiments using the Bunsen Burners. Megan Hare gives her account of the afternoon below:-

"Last week my class (Kestrels) went to Deanes to do some Science experiments. On our walk to The Deanes we saw some of our old friends who now go there. When we arrived at Deanes, we went to their new building and we were welcomed. Then we went to the top floor where the Science lab was. When we went in the Science room, we got our safety goggles and lab coats. Then we met Mr. Winkworth. The first experiment we did was creating a burglar alarm. We did this by using a voltage box, some wires, 2 pieces of cardboard and a buzzer or light bulb. Harrison, Jack and Me were successful on our first try. After that, we did an experiment to see whether the urine had glucose - glucose is sugar and it wasn't



really urine.
Harrison, Jack and
Me thought it was
food colouring and
one had sugar in it.
To do the
experiment, we used
a Bunsen Burner, a
tripod and beaker
filled with water and

test tubes with food colouring and one had a spoon full of sugar in it. With the Bunsen Burner, we put it on to the blue roaring flame and we put it under the tripod and it boiled the water until it looked like it was going to explode – it was probably up to 100 degrees. After, one of them changed

colour and that one had glucose in it.

After we did this, we changed the colour of the Bunsen Burner flame and my favourite was the sodium. My favourite part of the afternoon was using the Bunsen Burners."


It was lovely to be invited for afternoon tea and be involved with Toby's school. He enjoyed having his grandparents to share the many books that he likes reading!! Thank you so much.
