<u>Year 6 visit to the Isle of Wight &</u> <u>Restaurant Project</u>







Before half term, some of the Year 6 children went on the School Journey to the Isle of Wight and those children who stayed at TPS, had lots of fun working on their Restaurant Project and enjoyed different fun activities. Lucas Rowland (Squirrels) gives his account of his visit to the Isle of Wight and Kitty Brazier (Squirrels) describes her week at TPS.

"On Sunday I was a little nervous but very excited about going to the Isle of Wight. We arrived at school at 10.30am and Alan, our coach driver, loaded in all the suitcases and then we went to the Yellow Hall to get ready to leave. We got on the coach and it took around 2 hours to get to Portsmouth.





We stopped and had lunch and then we got on the ferry and it took about half an hour. I haven't been on a ferry before or to an English island so it was quite a shock. We got back on the coach to drive to the hotel and it took around half an hour again to get there. We settled into the hotel and my room was very nice. We had a key card. We then had dinner which was nice. It was roast chicken or a jacket potato. Then we went to bed and in the morning we had to be downstairs to have breakfast at 7.45am. Breakfast each day was a selection of cereals, a full English or a couple of pieces of toast. We left for Osbourne House. There were two main groups. The Smugalers and The Pirates, I was a Pirate. The Pirates had a tour of the house first and then had a workshop experience being a Royal servant. The lady was very strict! We had lunch outside and then we went back to the hotel, had half an hour in our room and then went downstairs for dinner. Then we went on a Smuggler's walk down to the beach. The path was very overgrown and we all took our torches. The next day, we visited the Isle of Wight Steam Railway Station and had a one hour ride on one of their steam trains. I loved watching the steam go over us! When we got off the train we went straight to have lunch and to watch a falconry show. It was really good and one of the birds flew about 5cm from my head. We went back to the hotel to have dinner and then we visited Shanklin Chine which was absolutely beautiful. My friend thought it should be one of the Seven Wonders of the World. After that we visited the beach nearby and had a play for around half an hour. On Wednesday, we visited the Brading Roman Villa and we saw the ruins of it. We also made our own mini

mosaic and sorted artefacts. After we visited Ventnor and had an ice cream but unfortunately mine fell off the cone. We were supposed to go on a miniature version of the Isle of Wight and have a paddle but it was raining so we couldn't. After Ventnor, we went to play crazy golf which was really fun. On Thursday, we visited the Dinosaur Isle, a museum about dinosaurs and had a talk with a man called Sam who worked there. He talked to us about different bones and fossils. I found it really interesting and my favourite was holding an elephant tooth and it was gigantic! After that we had lunch on the beach and we visited an Aqua Park for an hour which was really good and had lots of different challenges so you could find your own challenge either easy or hard. After that we went back to the

hotel and had a disco. Half way through everyone got into a giant Conga line and it wasn't even a Conga song. After that, everyone was exhausted so we went to bed. On Friday, Alan loaded our suitcases back onto the coach and it took around 30 minutes to get to the ferry. The ferry took around half an hour again and the coach took around two and a half hours to get home. We arrived back in Thundersley and got off and saw our parents, collected our suitcases and went home. I really loved going to the Isle of Wight for the week. 
