At Thundersley and across ROBUS, we are working on being a 'Strong learner' in a project called the ROBUS Research Review (RRR). In each school, staff have had training on supporting children through developing their metacognition and also through scaffolding, enabling them to be independent in their learning, no matter their ability in each subject. To be a strong learner, we feel that children need to be reflective, ready, responsible, resilient, engaged and selfmotivated. This further enhances our Thundersley learner traits of believing in ourselves, learning from mistakes, working hard and never giving up. Some children have many of these traits from day one in school, for most these take years to develop truly.

We often find that the area in which children show these traits most is in sport and this is why Thundersley so often does well in competition. You will know with your own child that often they can show determination on the football field or in the dance studio in a way they might not in reading or maths. This is one of the reasons that we are so keen at TPS to find something each child really loves and does well at - we can then use this in helping them to develop in other subjects 'You know you kept trying hard on the football pitch, even when your team was losing, well you can do that in reading too when it gets tough' 'You know when you made a mistake in your dance competition, you just kept going and didn't give up, you could do that in maths too'. We know those who are strong learners make lots more progress than those who are not. You can help your child to develop this at home by having those conversations and really celebrating when





they show that they are a strong learner at home.

Our Indoor Athletics team definitely showed that they were strong learners in PE, achieving the best result we have ever had in this competition by winning silver in the County Championships last week. This means that out of 400 schools who took part in Essex in the various heats, we beat all but one! What an achievement! We are so proud of each and every one and of all the staff who have supported them to get to these dizzy heights. We are yet to hear if we will be asked to represent Essex in the South of England competition.

Essex Sports Hall Athletics County Finals at Garons



After winning the District competition by over 80 points, we knew that Thundersley had a strong Sports Hall Athletics team, made up of 27 children from Years 5 and 6. However it's fair to say that the children took their performance to the next level on Wednesday! So many amazing personal bests were recorded in the field - from triple jump to javelin, and





on the track the children ran with such determination and desire, competing against the best in Essex for vital points. When the final results were in, the countdown was announced. 14 schools were present and one by one the positions were awarded and celebrated - until eventually it was announced that Thundersley had come second! The children should be so proud of their performance. Their team Sports Hall score of 1359 is the highest the school has ever recorded, and achieved 'Silver' on the National Sports Hall of Fame Awards Scheme. Mr Jetten, Mr Yorston and Mr Wilson were speechless. What an achievement. Many thanks go to the parents for helping with transport on the day and with the children's training sessions. George Fillary (Squirrels) gives his account of the event below:-

"It was really good and everyone did really well. The field events were great and they got us loads of points. I did standing triple jump and speed bounce. The boys 4x1 race, which was our last race, got us loads of points too. Last year we came 3rd and this year we came 2nd which is good. It was really nerve wracking and I couldn't tell if I was excited or nervous. I enjoyed the 4x1 the most as I like running. At the end, there were 14 schools and they announced it from last place to first. We got down to the last two and we were all excited to find out who had won and then they announced that we had come 2nd which we were happy with. 
Early Birds Breakfast Club & Treetops After School Club
