The tests are each day next week - a reading paper, three maths papers, grammar and spelling. This is the first time in 3 years that the tests have been taken and will give us all an idea, across the country, of the impact of the lockdowns and restrictions on children's learning. You will not be surprised to hear that our children have worked extremely hard this year, not just to prepare for these tests, but to ensure that they are ready for moving to Year 7 in September. The vast majority of them had small group tutoring either in Year 5 or this year, they have read extensively and during lockdown, they were whizzes at online learning. They are an extremely conscientious, fun loving and positive group this year and we know that they will do their absolute best they can in these tests. A huge thanks to the children for their hard work and to the teachers for their dedication

For the week ended 29<sup>th</sup> April 2022 there were 7 classes who achieved 97% attendance or above. Well done to Rabbits who


