

Dear Parent/Carer,

Today is the beginning of Children's Mental Health week 2024. Each year we take part in this initiative because we believe so fervently in supporting children's wellbeing as well as their academic development. Last week, we had the Life Space workshop tent in school from our SCARF Personal Development Scheme team in which children were able to explore their feelings and learn about such ideas as resilience, gratitude and how to be emotionally well. This is vital work for us, for our children and for our staff.

The children look great in their nonuniform gear - and will learn this week about making their voice be heard. They will learn that they can change the world and that their thoughts on issues that are important to them are important to us too. We have a strong voice at Thundersley through our fantastic School Council, but we are never complacent and are always looking for ways that we can listen to what our children are saying.

Sport and getting outdoors is so good for children's mental health! Lots of sport took place last week at Thundersley, including clubs, matches and PE. We also had the delight of four of our pupils joining staff training so that we could learn how to teach such skills as forward rolls and handstands in gymnastics.

I was just delighted to see so many parents attend the super Anxiety workshop last Wednesday. Kaisha and Lauren gave us all some really great strategies for supporting our children and also reminded us that a level of anxiety is normal in all of us, including our children. It is when it stops us from doing things that it becomes tricky. I know that this is an area that we will continue to work on and support families with in the future. Year 2 Fire of London Day

On Monday, 29th January 2024, the Year 2 children enjoyed a day experiencing life as it would have been in 1666 London before, during and after the



Great Fire. The children learned about the issues of the time, with the opportunity to participate in a range of cross-curricular activities and crafts. Everyone had a fabulous time and Rey Higgs (Robins) and Preston Hooper (Ladybirds) give their joint description of their exciting day below:-



"We dressed up like 1666 people. We did some sewing and we made our first initial We did some activities. We had to brush all the dirt off to find out what shop we had and we had the perfumery.

We made some perfume and we made it out of flowers and it smelt really nice. There was a silver rock and we had to boil it and pour it into a mould. Then when it was hard, we had to get it out of the mould and put it into the water. The mould buttons were just clay but after they were put into the fire, they were hard silver and it was like a type of metal. We also made some ink and we got to write our names with a guill which is like a feather. We also had a hammer and we made a leather bookmark and we used a nail to try and hammer our

names into it. We had to bash it 3 times. There were rat catchers called Millie, Eleny and Ruby and they had to go and tie the rats' tails around the brooms. We made a candle and we had to dip it 20







times into hot wax. We made some bread. It was dough and we had to crush the wheat which made the flour. We had to squish the dough into a circle and make some holes or we could cut it into 3 strips and make it into a plait. After all the activities, we asked the grown-ups some

questions and they told us the answers. Preston's favourite part was sewing his initial and Rey's favourite part was hammering the leather. They both thought the day was AMAZING!!!

LifeSpace

This week we have been lucky enough to welcome back the SCARF team to deliver Mental Wellbeing Workshops to all classes across the school. The children have participated in



interactive activities in the life-size inflatable classroom whilst exploring a range of themes. Some of the themes included resilience and bouncing back, emotional and self-regulation, gratitude and acceptance. These workshops helped to give the children a voice, feel empowered and enable them to articulate their needs and feelings. Chace Donovan-Toone (Squirrels) gives her account of the session below:-

"We went in and we talked about decisions and we watched a video about some boys who were hanging out. They were all talking about football and cars and two of them thought it was boring so they started rummaging around the house and found an alcohol cupboard. They started filling a glass with alcohol and tried to peer pressure one of the boys to drink it. He said "No" and the other boys were sticking up for him so the two boys who were pressurising him left as they thought it was boring. Then we had a discussion about the decisions made and what was right and wrong. Then we talked about having friends, groups and personal time and deciding in our own opinions what is
