READING

- Reading is hugely important and is an indicator of future success.
- Partnership between home and school.
- Our school vision we want our children to become fluent, independent readers who enjoy books and read for pleasure.
- Encourage them to read daily to ensure their fluency and enjoyment of text continues.
- Children will have the opportunity to select books from our library.
- Children can read their favourite books from home.
- In school your children will be reading higher level texts and classics.
- DEAR: Drop Everything And Read.
- Children will be rewarded for reading 5 times a week with our new badge and certificate scheme.
- Recommended reading list.



DEVELOPING READING SKILLS

- Decoding: this is the skill that parents/carers are generally most familiar with and deals with the varying strategies used by children to make sense of the words on the page.
- Retrieval and recall: early readers need to develop this skill, in order to locate important information and to retell stories and describe events.
- **Inference:** reading between the lines. Encouraging children to make inferences based on clues in the text.
- Structure and organisation: as children read a wider range of text types, they need to be able to comment on the features of each and how they are organised.
- Language: specifically thinking about the language choices made by writers, their possible reasons for making those choices and the effect the choices have on the reader.
- Purpose and viewpoint: Children need to understand that writers write for a purpose and to be able to recognise that this will have an impact on the way a text is written.
- Making links: as adults, we are constantly making links between ideas and experiences. Good readers connect the book they are reading with real life experiences; with other books read and stories heard; with films; and with the context in which they were written.

READING RECORD



- Please record when the children read.
- Aiming for 5 reading sessions over the week.
- Children can log their reading efforts to ensure they progress in our challenge.
- We will check the diaries as often as possible.
- We may use the reading journals for other useful key information.
- Please avoid using the diary to communicate sensitive or urgent matters.



SPELLINGS



Weekly spellings

Each week different spelling patterns will be taught. These patterns will sent home on a Friday. We will test the children on these spellings the following Friday.

Children will learn to spell using a range of strategies and activities. Our children will be encouraged to practise these patterns as homework too.

In addition there is a list of Year 3 and 4 words that the children are expected to know related to their age.

We will work through these over the course of the year in class, but your help with these words at home would be greatly appreciated.






MATHS










MATHS - TIMES TABLES

- SumDog and 'Hit The Button' as well as numerous apps. Writing, chanting and singing work too!




