Dear Parents/Carers,

Our children have come back excited to learn and as I go in and out of classes, I see how focused and keen they are during lessons. I know we are all delighted to be in school! We still have some space in several of our clubs, which start in the week beginning 17th January 2022. Mrs. Waumsley will send a list of clubs with spaces early next week if your child has not yet signed up for one. Our lunchtime clubs start next week and I have attached the lunchtime programme. I am so grateful to all staff who run these clubs. they are such an important part of our curriculum offer and help our children to broaden their horizons and develop socially and emotionally as well as learning a new skills.



As you know, my normal mantra for how parents can help their children at home is to read, read, read and that has not changed, but

I would also like to touch on Maths and what a difference you can make to that at home. The key to children enjoying Maths and being successful is being able to manipulate numbers effortlessly and just like fluency in reading, it only comes from practice. Practice for younger children is constant counting – as you walk to school, when they are in the bath, in the car, backwards, forwards, in ones, in twos. singing, shouting and so on. As they get older, if you can help them to rote learn their number bonds without having to count, it makes a huge difference. First, they need to know bonds within 10 and once those are cracked, they need to go above 10. If children know that 6 and 3 makes 9, then they soon grasp that 60 and 30 makes 90, 600 and 300 makes 900 etc without any effort. Finally, for the children from Year 2 onwards, it is the times tables that they need to know off by heart. By the end of Year 4, they need to know all of their times tables to 12 X 12 and in June of Year 4, children sit a Government multiplication check. There





are many apps that you can use to support your child such as SumDog, Times Table Rock Stars and Hit the button. A short time each day spent doing some number work can change children's outlook on Maths for a lifetime!

Enjoy your weekend and happy counting (and reading of course!).
