For the week ended 25<sup>th</sup> February 2022 there were 7 classes who achieved 97% attendance or above. Well done to Sparrows who



## <u>Year 2 - Great Fire of London Day</u>

The children learnt about the issues of the time, with the opportunity to participate in a range of cross-curricular activities and crafts. The children were able to keep the items they made. Griffin Gibson (Ladybirds) and Skylar Player (Robins) tell of their exciting experience below:-

"We went to the hall and then there were some tables full of stuff we could make. The first table I went to had these scent bags that smelt yummy. Then, after that, I went to another scent bag, which didn't smell that nice as it was medicine but it made you feel better. There was a table with a candle. I went







through ten times and then I got my own candle. There was a smoke machine that produced smoke. We were pretending that there was water in the well and putting it over the smoke. There were also people catching rats with two sticks. There was also a table where we could sew. We had a piece of card and colourful string and had to make a mini blanket. There was an ink table where we had to write with a quill on a piece of paper. It was hard and messy. We also made an iron button for Mr. Pepys' coat. We wore a special costume all day in school. "We met someone called Master Patrick and there were different stations set up. There was the Chandlers - where we made candles and I made one for my mummy. He said that when we see Mr. Pepys we would have to give it to him but I knew that he is not alive anymore. I also made a scent bag which smelt really nice. I loved it so I'll never forget that day."
