Evidence shows that reading for pleasure - fiction or non fiction - is associated not just with good achievement in reading, but across the whole curriculum, including Maths, in Primary School. It can be a challenge to encourage reading for pleasure in many young children, especially with so many other competing activities at their disposal! The best way to do this is to read to them. All the evidence is showing that children who are read to, as well as reading to someone on a regular basis, make super progress. That is why we make time each day in all year groups from EYFS to Year 6 to read a great book to the children. I know that many parents at Thundersley both hear their children read as well as reading to them - and it shows in the progress the children are making. There is nothing better than cuddling up before bedtime with a book. Reading to children increases their general knowledge, vocabulary, comprehension, empathy, their love of reading and it also counts towards their Thundersley 5 a week!
